Annual General Meeting Wildwood School Council

May 13, 2024

Meeting called to order 6:34 pm.

Diane welcomed everyone to the AGM – the financial report being reviewed is August 2022 to July 2023 to align with the School Council's fiscal year.

Council Business:

Diane motioned to approve the AGM meeting minutes from May 8, 2023. Rachel seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Heather motioned to approve the minutes from the April 2024 School Council meeting. Rachel seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Fundraising efforts for the financial year 2022-2023 included Healthy Hunger, Kokomo (\$5,000 without silent auction) and the Grade 6 celebration. Noted that this year's Grade 6 celebration is with Fit Ninja instead of Calaway Park.

2022-2023 expenditures included Activity Day, hospitality (teachers' dinner on conference nights, yearend teacher celebration, teachers' gift cards), Decidedly Jazz Danceworks residency and classroom expenses for music, art and physical education supplies/equipment. Noted that for the current fiscal year, we are funding a coding residency.

Financial Report: The financials have been audited. The fiscal year-end for the Wildwood School Council being discussed is July 2023.

- Income was from Healthy hunger \$2,708.60, Grade 6 fundraising \$545.73, Kokomo beach fundraiser \$4,458.56, for a total income of \$6,091.10.
- The starting account balance was \$22,887, with an ending balance of \$16,534.17.
- The council spent more than it made last year, spending net \$12,793.93.

Positions to be filled for Wildwood School Council: Chair, Secretary, Key communicator/CBE connections, Auditors, Fundraisers, Kokomo Family fun night committee, Worker Bees and Tasty Treats Coordinator.

Patricia Bolger – School Trustee, Ward 6 and 7:

Thank you for attending our School Council meeting. Patricia is a first term trustee and former teacher.

Funding overview: CBE received \$85M more than last year, total Alberta Education funding is \$1.4B. Budget increase was based on enrollment only, did not consider inflation (so this is actually a decrease in funding on a per student basis). The CBE welcomed additional 15,600 students over past 3 years, expecting 9,000 additional students next year. Student population is increasingly diverse and complex. Student enrollment for CBE is expected to be 142,000 by end of the school year.

Board advocacy: Budget 2024/25 does not provide adequate funding for a growing school district. The provincial budget does not address inflation and the cost of supporting students

with increasingly complex learning needs. In its 2024-27 fiscal plan, government has committed to funding levels below growth and inflation.
